Our liability under this guarantee shall your consignment be released in acknowledgment, of the payment total amount not exceeding R 13,980.00 (Thirteen Thousand, Nine Hundred & Eighty Rand) payable by the consignee (Mrs. [redacted]). This guarantee is valid up to and including or such earlier day as the original of the guarantee is returned to us.

Claims, if any, under this guarantee, stating that if, Mrs. [redacted] fails to pay an invoiced delivery payment under the ("Contract Act Law of 2012"). And (ii) the due date for such payment has been approved by the advocate's cabinet members. Written form states that, payment ought to be completed, not later than the Expiry date to be valid 05/05/2017. An advocate shall confirm that the signatures thereon are legally binding upon you.

Unless other follows by the wording of this guarantee, this guarantee is subject to the Uniform of South Africa Revenue Service, Post Office Services Oversea (SARSPOSOVERSEA) and South African Supreme court. These guarantee shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of South Africa and shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the South African courts.
