PORTS OF ENTRY

EXTENSION OF OPERATIONAL HOURS AT SELECTED PORTS OF ENTRY FOR THE 2021/22 FESTIVE PERIOD.

Peak periods are characterised by the increase of traveller movement between South Africa and her neighbours. One of the operational responses to deal with potential congestion at ports, is the extension of operational hours to allow for continued movement during peak periods.

The upcoming 2021/22 Festive season, is one such period when we request the Minister of Home Affairs (as the responsible Authority) to consider the proposal to extent hours temporarily. Stakeholders at ports of entry and the countries sharing borders with the Republic of South Africa have been engaged and agreed on the dates to effect the extended operational hours reflected below:

The Minister of Home Affairs has approved the extension of operational hours for Ports of Entry as listed above. The extended hours shall come into effect as indicated above and the Minister has the prerogative to withdraw the extension of hours if necessary. It is the responsibility of port managers to ensure that the extension of hours as reflected in their respective operational plans is enforced within the broader approved time frames.
