Appointment of a Panel of Suppliers to Supply SARS Customs Unit with Detector Dog Equipment, Marine Equipment and Other Consumables Business Requirements Specifications (BRS)

1 CATEGORY A - DETECTOR DOG EQUIPMENT AND OTHER CONSUMABLES

1.1 Background

The SARS Customs Detector Dog Unit was established to contribute to the SARS strategic objectives and the aims of the Customs Border Operations, Customs Compliance and Enforcement yearly business plan to increase compliance, prevent and detect hidden narcotics, endangered species, currency, copper wire, cell phones and tobacco products including cigarettes in vehicles, trucks, trailers, vessels, aircraft, containers, cargo, mail, rail, luggage, and buildings.

The basic training of a detector dog to conduct searches in all the areas of utilisation listed above requires the provisioning of specialised and standardised training and dog handling equipment that is of a high quality to prevent injury or harm to the dog and public in operations at ports of entry, borderline and / or inland operations.

The procurement and provisioning of standardised and equipment of a high standard prevent wasteful expenditure (frequent replacement), ensure sustainability and high detector dog working standard in operations.

1.2 List of Equipment and Consumables

The following specialised detector dog handling and training equipment is critical to ensure compliance to relevant legislation and must be of a high standard to promote the health and safety of the detector dog in operations. The equipment required is not limited to the below list:

- Detector dog leashes (elephant webbing) for working dogs.
- Detector dog puppy lines / long leash (elephant webbing) for working dogs.
- Choke chains for working dogs.
- Collar chains for working dogs.
- Dog micro-chip and scanner.
- Multitool (knife) with pouch to fit tactical belt.
- Rewarding article (ball, toy, clicker).
- Dog harnesses for working dogs.
- Dog comb and brushes.
- Warning signs – “Customs Dogs @ Work”.
- Dog Shampoo.
- Safe and durable water bowls.
- Safe and durable food bowls.

- Portable water and food bowls.
- Sleeping benches or Bakelite sleeping boxes.
- Shade netting for kennels.
- Rubber brooms for kennel cleaning.
- Hosepipes with fittings.
- High pressure sprayers.
- Fly catchers to be installed at kennel area with frequent replacement.
- Disinfectant for kennels and vehicle kennels.
- Chlorinators for kennels.
- Dog shoes – heat and extreme cold.
- 6 birth dog trailers with cooling sprayers; (SABS approved).
- Portable yellow warning lights.
- Luggage cases for basic and refresher training at the unit.
- Scent boxes (small and large) for scent discrimination training.
- Transport and Protective cases for authentic training samples.
- Gumboots for cleaning kennels.
- Helicopter dropped hoisting harnesses for Dogs and Dog handlers with safety gear.
- Fire extinguishers.
- Gloves – Durable for inspections, searches & dog handling.
- Gloves – latex for sample handling.
- Medical kits for dogs and handlers.
- Collapsible ladders for inspections.
- Life jackets for dogs and handlers – support to marine unit on operations.
- Safety glasses for handlers.
- Static / moveable but fixed dog kennels – gymkhana type.
- Vehicle dog kennels as per spec.
- Go-Pros Camera / Body Camera
- Dog tracker – productivity monitoring.
- Training wall for scent reinforcement training at the unit.

1.3 Detector Dog Unit Regions and Delivery Addresses

2 **CATEGORY B - MARINE EQUIPMENT AND OTHER CONSUMABLES**

2.1 **Background**

The Customs Marine Unit was established to perform the following functions aligned to organisational strategic objectives to prevent and detect cross border smuggling via sea borderline and seaports of entry:

- Customs vessel outer-anchorage patrols and high visibility.
- Customs seaport patrols and high visibility.
- Customs vessel engagements/interventions/rummages.
- Goods/services control (Chandler services).
- Small craft inspections and rummages.
- Territorial Water interventions/patrols.
- Maritime operational support.
- Joint operations between agencies and other government departments.
- Quayside / Berth patrols and interventions.
- Commercial and fishing vessels.
- Off Port Limit movement control.
- Risk based Intel /Information driven operations in and around seaports of entry.
- Hoisting operations with DDU and Customs Inspection teams.
- Passenger liner operations – goods control.

The Marine Unit operations are mandated in the Customs and Excise Act, Act 91 of 1964 Sec 4C and are regulated by the South African Maritime Safety Authority Act 5 of 1998 (SAMSA) in operations.

It is imperative to provide the marine unit skippers, deckhands and intervention teams with the correct, standardised, and specialised equipment listed below to ensure compliance to relevant legislation including the

Occupational Health and Safety Act No.85 of 1993, to conduct operations up to 40 NM at sea, in and around seaports of entry and sea borderline including small craft harbours.

2.2 List of Equipment and Consumables

The equipment required is not limited to the below list:

- Communication – VHF radio and two-way radios.
- Binoculars.
- GPS and Radar system.
- Satellite telephone.
- Rechargeable Torches.
- Pepper spray.

- High tech and SABS approved life jackets.
- Specialised Marine Sunglasses.
- Gloves – Durable for inspections (Rummages).
- Gloves – latex for sample handling.
- Fridge for boats.
- Microwave for boats.
- Loudhailer.
- Blue warning lights as approved by SAMSA.
- Safety equipment for boats as per SAMSA regulations.
- Fire extinguishers for vehicles and boats.
- Pontoons for boats.
- Boat covers.
- Engine covers.
- Ropes for boat docking / mooring.
- Toilet cleaner and paper for boat toilets.
- Disinfectant for boats.
- Soap for boat maintenance.
- Water buckets and brooms for boats cleaning.
- Gum boots for boat maintenance.
- Medical Kit for boats.
- South African flag for each boat.
- Safety harnesses for boat crew and rummage officers.

- Safety helmets.
- Lubricants for emergencies.
- Salt Away Flush Kits (Connections and fittings).
- Jerry cans for water and petrol.
- Toolbox with emergency tools – Cordless Drill with Socket Set.
- Vessel hoisting equipment and safety gear.
- Multitool (knife) with pouch to fit tactical belt.
- Large cabin compass with cap.
- Horseshoe lifebuoy.
