<p>I wanted to enquire with regards to the submission for RFP 43/2025B/A. When submitting should there be two separate folders for submission or should everything be submitted in one folder but in two parts?</p>	<p>Bidders are required to submit a separate, clearly marked file for each office they are bidding for. For instance, if you intend to bid for both Part A and Part B of the tender, you must prepare and submit two separate bid responses—one for each office.</p>
<p>When submitting for part A as an example the main RFP document says there is a folder 1 for technical information and folder 2 for pricing information. Should those two be separate or in one folder for submission?</p>	<p>Please refer to paragraph 11 – Table 11: Checklist of Returnable Documents in the Main RFP, which states: <i>“The pricing information must be included as a separate file (File 2) and should not be included in the technical file (File 1)”</i>.</p> <p>Accordingly, bidders are required to submit two files: File 1 for the technical response and File 2 for the pricing response.</p>
<p>We are currently preparing a proposal for RFP 43/2025A: Appointment of a service provider for the supply and installation of carpet tiles at Khanyisa Office.</p> <p>We are writing to request clarification regarding Section 7.4, Table 6, Item 2 (Technical Evaluation Criteria), which specifies the requirement for 5 reference letters or completion certificates for "Refurbishment works supplying and installing carpet flooring" (p. 11).</p> <p>Given our company's GB grading, we have successfully completed various large-scale refurbishment projects that encompass a broad scope of building works. We would like to confirm if SARS will accept reference letters for general Refurbishment works (GB graded projects) that include flooring as part of the overall scope, or if the evaluation strictly requires projects that focus exclusively on the supply and installation of carpet flooring.</p>	<p>Yes. SARS will accept reference letters for general refurbishment works (GB graded projects) that include flooring as part of the overall scope. The reference letter must clearly indicate that flooring was included in the scope of work.</p>
<p>Item no. 2: Bidders must submit 5 reference letters (not older than 8 years from 2018 – 2026) or completion certificates of similar projects of refurbishment works supplying and installing carpet floor from their current or previous clients.</p> <p>The enquiry made was “will the client consider the reference letter or completion certificates for supplying and installing of vinyl sheeting/tiles as a similar project</p>	<p>Yes</p>
