The tender is mainly requesting for a software management tool and not for developers to come through and develop a bespoke tool.
2.	The business requirement specification refers to, the ability to deploy on-premises or cloud solution and SARS goes to an extend of indicating that, SARS will be providing a platform for that. 10.	<i>[Question] IaaS & PaaS is mentioned, are these public cloud vendors or private cloud?</i>	Private cloud
11.	<i>[Question] SaaS is also mentioned in the RFP document. What is the expectation of SARS here? Typically, SaaS vendors doesn't allow scanning of their environments, which implies we'd need to pull the license data via API or some mechanism. Is this assumption correct?</i>	Yes, that is correct.
12.	Ownership and location information – <i>[Question] Is the expectation that location is derived from some data attributes or are there other indicators on the device for location-based data?</i>	The data attributes for device ownership and location will be made available.
13.	Asset Relationship Management – <i>[Question] Does this requirement refer to infrastructure components and architecture or the complete environment which includes endpoints (workstations)?</i>	Asset Relationship Management refers specifically to software asset relationship management.
14.	Ensure optimization of the licenses and realize return on investment – <i>[Question] Is the requirement from SARS here for automated actions or to demonstrate optimization.</i>	The requirement from SARS is to have both automated actions and to demonstrate optimization.
15.	Identify software that needs to be decommissioned / retired – <i>[Question] What process does SARS envisage for this requirement? Based on decision making process or does SARS have a gold master definition for Software assets?</i>	The SAM tool must be able to harvest end of life and end of support information and be able to report on software that needs to be decommissioned / retired.
