1.	In case of partnership, should the other partner also attend the briefing?	No, only one partner should attend both, the compulsory briefing session and the compulsory price templates workshop session.
2.	Draft Agreement, should this be signed for submission, or do we only acknowledge and only sign on award?	There is no need to sign the agreement at this stage of the process, but it is important that you indicate in your submission through the relevant contract response template that you are agreeable to the terms and conditions of the agreement. If not agreeable, please indicate the extent which you are not agreeable by highlighting same in the contract response template and track change the mark ups/comments on the agreement.
3.	what is required to display the capability to handle or process the 70 million SMS traffic?	A 12-month SLA report showing the number of SMS delivered in the past 5 years.
4.	What supporting evidence / input would be required / expected if you are not Bidder A from Mamelodi?	The question is unclear. Can the bidder re- submit the question and be specific as to which Tower and Section.

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5.	<p>Must the ICASA / ECS(I-ECS) Licence be in the name of the parent company or subsidiary of the bidder or can the bidder sub-contract for this requirement?</p>	<p>The license must be in the name of Parent Company or subsidiary and cannot be sub-contracted.</p> <p>The requirements state as follows, <i>“The Bidder is required to submit proof of licence(s) it holds, together with a warranty that its licence holding enables it to provide the services for which it is bidding for. The Bidder may rely on regulatory licences held by a parent company or subsidiary, provided a satisfactory explanation of how such reliance will comply with regulatory requirements and that the warranty of compliance is provided. The Bidder may not rely on a third party’s licence(s). The evidence of licence holding must correspond with the licence holding claimed”</i></p>

SARS is open to various cloud providers as long as the security constraints & service levels are met.</p> <p>1) Estimate only. For the 2023 calendar year SARS sent a monthly minimum of 10 million and a maximum of 30 million SMS per month. These figures are likely to increase up to 20% per annum. The figures are only indicative of volumes and will be split 50:50 (may change depending on price and other factors) between the two providers appointed.</p> <p>2) From a contact centre perspective, the Call centre agents do not respond to any SMS's via another SMS. The only integration of SMS into the contact centre is via USSD (*134*7277#) when they chose option 4 eBooking, then the Call centre agent call them</p>

7.	<p>On mandatory evaluation, do you still qualify if you have implemented a client of more than 100 sites but for an example 50 sites only on SD-WAN</p>	<p>The Bidder will not qualify to tender, the requirement is clear "<i>similar in size to SARS for the past 1 (one) year, to at least 1 (one) South African customer, covering 100 (one hundred) or more sites.</i>" The SARS network is far larger than 100 sites / branches, the actual requirement was adjusted to adapt to the minimum for large enterprises.</p>
8.	<p>Tab 1: Refers to Pricing being Valid for 180 Days - In the event where SARS does not Adjudicate and Award within those days - Will be the bidder be allowed to adjust pricing in the event SARS asks for extension of the validity days from the Bidders?</p>	<p>If SARS does not adjudicate and conclude the tender within 180 days, SARS will request all the bidders that would have responded to the tender to extend the validity period.</p>
9.	<p>For TC3, how do we cater for ONCE-OFF integration versus monthly subscription</p>	<p>Complete TC1 – see note -</p> <p>1. The pricing provided in this template TC.1 is for all services required to affect the transition (SMS, USSD, MMS, URL Shortner).</p>

11.	<p>The following are indicated as requirements but with no provision in the pricing templates:</p> <p>Tower D: BRS section 6.4.2.1 Private 5G: indicates that “The Service Provider must provide a reliable, high-bandwidth, and low-latency private 5G solution, with the ability to support multiple enterprise use-cases on a single network.”</p> <p>Tower V: The BRS section 7.1 states "The Bidders in Tower V must supply a proposal for a Contact Centre as a Service that will support 1 000 agents with integration into Microsoft Teams."</p>	<p>Tower D (Private 5G), Pricing template TD.8 supplied.</p> <p>Tower V (Contact Centre Proposal), the Bidder must attach their own proposal with costs as part of the TRT Submission for Tower V, as a supporting document for Capability, # 1.3 , “Bidder’s Strategic Direction”. Same for the MS Teams integration proposal excluding E5 licenses as this is out of scope.</p>
12.	<p>6.4.1.1 - 6.4.1.2</p> <p>Context: Under 6.4.1.1.1 of the BRS 02-2024 2-1 we note an EXPLICIT instruction that satellite circuits must be integrated into the SDWAN Architecture. We did not notice the same instruction for other site categories.</p> <p>Question: Which sites are in scope for inclusion under SDWAN? Is SARS able to provide an explicit indication of this.</p>	<p>The following WAN services are <u>included</u> as part of the requested SD-WAN solution:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. MPLS sites 2. Satellite sites <p>The following WAN services are <u>excluded</u> from the requested SD-WAN solution as stipulated in the BRS:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • External/Public Network Connectivity (Network services required to connect Third-Party providers, hyper-scalers, cloud providers, and any co-location facility. This will ensure a 100% alignment.</p>	<p>Bidder must not make any changes on pricing templates, SARS will amend the pricing templates where necessary to ensure that Bidders' price submission is comparable to others.</p>
15.	<p>Site list</p> <p>Will SARS, please provide geographic co-ordinates for all of the sites. We have used the addresses provided and have not been able to plot some locations. Please can you share a list of co-ordinates as well, we want to ensure that we have absolutely accurate locations.</p>	<p>Yes, the SARS' Site Classifications will be updated accordingly with co-ordinates, Bidders must continue vising the website and NT E-Tender for updates.</p>
16.	<p>6.4.1.1</p> <p>Context: "The data centre sites will be the aggregate of the remote sites with an assumed concurrency ratio.</p> <p>This also relates to the question on sites ""in-scope"" for SDWAN as it would affect the aggregate bandwidth required at the data centres."</p>	<p>As per BRS, SARS is in the planning phase to migrate the current MPLS network to a more cost-effective underlay network, which will include internet broadband, fibre, wireless, LTE, and any similar physical network infrastructure. A managed SD-WAN service is then required as a virtual overlay.</p>

All proposed services and solutions must be based on the mentioned OEM. SARS largest WAN links @ Brooklyn is only 1 gb/s, the Meraki MX450 supports bandwidth required. Also refer to question # 12.</p>

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19.	<p>All Price Lists</p> <p>There are once off charges for different speeds, terms and products and the pricing will differ per product offering, site, and SLA. We would need guidance on how to handle present this once off setup/install pricing.</p>	<p>Installation / setup pricing will be amortized over the initial term of 5 years or remaining term as per MSA. SARS has added TD11.1 for Bidders to supply installation charges per technology.</p>
20.	<p>TC1 to TC7</p> <p>Instructions in index indicate that each tab is optional, we require guidance on how we indicate that we are not responding to a tab without invoking the assumption that a blank or zero is a non-response and not a zero charge.</p>	<p>Kindly note that all relevant price sheet that the bidder will be responding to, must be completed in full.</p> <p>If the bidder will be responding to certain sub-category on Category A, can the Bidder refer to page 5 of 76 in the <u>SARS RFP 02-2024 Main Document</u> for further guidance as to which taps must the bidder complete.</p>
